2008 St. Marys River cleanup is March 15

CALLAHAN, Fla., Feb. 28, 2008 — The 2008 St. Marys River Celebration, the annual spring cleaning of the river and its tributaries, will be held on Saturday, March 15, in Nassau and Baker counties in Florida and Camden and Charlton counties in Georgia.

The Celebration is a one-day volunteer cleanup of the St. Marys River.

Throughout the four-hour event, volunteers from four counties will comb the shorelines of the rivers, lakes and streams of the St. Marys River system.

The cleanup takes place from 8 a.m. until noon, followed by a celebration lunch for volunteers until 2:30 p.m. at White Oak Plantation. Tickets will be distributed to cleanup volunteers and are required to gain entry to White Oak. Volunteers also will receive the newly designed St. Marys River Celebration T-shirt.

Approximately 525 volunteers participated in last year's Celebration, removing more than 45,000 pounds of trash from the waterway and its banks.

Over the past decade, about 6,725 St. Marys River Celebration volunteers have removed more than a half million pounds of trash from the river and tributaries.
